

Town of Hollis Maine Absentee Voting.

1. The State of Maine Municipalities allow requesting an Absentee Ballot (electronically, in writing or by a telephone request) or In Person voting also called voting in the presence of the Clerk.
Voter Registration Hours for the Town of Hollis will be
Tues, Thurs, Friday 9 a.m.-noon 1 p.m.-4 p.m. and
Wednesday 11 am- 3 pm 4 p.m.-7p.m.
Absentee Ballots may be returned by mail, in-person (during town hall hours) or placed in the secure drop box located at the Hollis Town Hall.
All Absentee Ballots must be received by the Town Clerk on November 3, 2020 at 8 p.m. to be counted.
Absentee Ballots must be returned to the drop box or town clerk in the town where the voter is registered.
2. Town of Hollis Absentee Ballot Processing will be held on
Tuesday, October 27, 2020 9 am Inspection, 10 am processing begins.
Thursday, October 29, 2020 9 am Inspection, 10 am processing begins.
Friday, October 30, 2020 9 am Inspection, 10 am processing begins.
Saturday, October 31, 2020 9 am Inspection, 10 am processing begins.
Sunday, November 1, 2020 9 am Inspection, 10 am processing begins.
Monday, November 2, 2020 9 am Inspection, 10 am processing begins.
3. Hollis voting is held at the **Hollis Community Building located at 35 Town Farm Road, Hollis, ME 04042. Polls open at 7a.m. and 8 p.m.**
4. Hollis Election Staff will use the schedule and process described by the Maine Secretary of State's Election Office to reconcile our vote totals at the close of polls on election night.
5. Candidates or Candidates Representatives or the general public are welcome to attend the close of elections and must stay outside of the official voting guardrail and no talking is allowed.
6. Maine Municipalities use the chain of custody for ballots and process's prescribed by the Maine Secretary of State's Office.
7. The Secretary of Sates website at www.maine.gov/elections has information available for Maine voters and how to request an absentee ballot, register to vote and the hours and location of each polling place. The Official Town of Hollis website is www.hollismaine.org election information will be listed under the town clerk- department under elections. Voters are encouraged to utilize these official websites.

[Secretary Dunlap launches absentee ballot tracking service](#)

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AUGUSTA - Secretary of State Matthew Dunlap is launching a new online service today that will allow voters to track the status of their absentee ballot.

The Absentee Ballot Request Status service <https://apps.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl> is now live, located at the top of the online absentee ballot request page. Any voter who has requested an absentee ballot can now track the status of their request, and of the ballot itself, through the Tuesday, Nov. 3, 2020 General Election.

"This tracker will give voters peace of mind knowing that their ballot is on its way, and later, that their ballot has been safely received and accepted by the municipal clerk," said Secretary Dunlap.

Voters must enter their name, date of birth, and city of residence to check on the progress of their ballot. They will see a grid that will show whether their request was accepted or rejected by the clerk, as well as the date it was delivered to the voter, and the date when the completed ballot was returned to the clerk: <https://apps.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl>

The tracking service was developed by the State of Maine e-government service provider, InforME, in coordination with the Department of the Secretary of State. It populates data directly from the central voter registration database, which is continually updated by all municipal clerks statewide.

Voters can request an absentee ballot via the online service or directly with their municipal clerk through Thursday, Oct. 29, 2020; or in-person with the municipal clerk through 5 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 30, 2020. All ballots must be in hand with the municipal clerk no later than 8 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 3, 2020.
